Experiment with Measurement

1) Finds things at home that:

- are the length of their handspan.
- the length of their foot
- the length of their thumb
- shorter than their height
- taller than their height

2) Go on a measurement hunt to find things that are

- 4, 6, 8 paper clips long
- the same size as a piece of yarn, longer than the yarn, shorter than the yarn

3) Keep a record of your child's height by marking a wall lightly. Kids love to see how big they are getting and compare themselves to others.

4) Involve children in daily activities around the house:

How should we measure? Which is the best tool to measure with?

5) Play Mother May I? Each player asks the leader to take small, medium or large steps.

6) Who can throw a ball the farthest? What pumpkin weighs more?

7) Sand and Water tables Use measuring cups and spoons to fill and empty different-sized bottles and buckets. Estimate first and then count how many scoops it takes to fill the container.
